


# What is Community-Based Fisheries Management (CBFM)?

- Is a fisheries management approach → community-driven and encompasses an ecosystem approach to sustain livelihoods and ensure resilient island communities.
- Is common in the Pacific Region due to strong customary laws and traditional governance of coastal fisheries.

#### What is Scaling-Up?

Moving from small pockets of effective coastal fisheries management to meaningful proportions of the coastal environment.



## Why Scale-up?




- Coastal resources are under increasing threat of overfishing, exacerbated by climate change & COVID-19 pandemic.
- ➤ Pacific Islands Countries &
  Territories (PICTs) large ocean
  states but limited national
  government resources →
  harnessing the collective
  power of local communities for
  effective coastal fisheries
  management.
- Empower local communities.



## Pacific Framework for Action on Scaling up CBFM: 2021-2025





#### **Purpose of The Framework:**

Provide guidance to PICTs in developing, prioritising and implementing national actions for scaling-up CBFM that support local communities and achieve national and regional policy goals'.
