
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

THAILAND Cases: 7,000 Deaths: 60


COVID-19 situation

(end of 2020)

Severe impacts on the economy

Low-risk sector: agriculture, forestry, and fisheries

- Short-term and moderate COVID-19 control measures
- Minimal production losses



Introduction

Impacts of COVID-19 on the global fish value chain (FAO study in 2020)

Vulnerable groups

- Women
 - greater risk of infection due to close contact with others at all stages of the value chain
 - job loss due to closure or reduction of processing and marketing activities
- Small-scale fishers
 - fully dependent on fishing
 - lack the capital
 - limited access to health services

Marine capture fishery

- Decreased fishing operations of SSF and IDF
- Shortage of labor force
- Reduced demand for fish and fishery products from the food services sector
- Dropped prices of fish
- Canceled key seafood trade events across the world

Gaps

Lack of comprehensive assessments

- Impacts of COVID-19 on fishers in SSF and IDF
- Relief measures to mitigate the impacts

Need for tools to mitigate the impacts and sustain marine capture fishery in Thailand

Fishing technology extension

Objectives

Identify the impacts of COVID-19 on fishers in SSF and IDF along the Gulf of Thailand

Distinguish the support received by fishers in SSF and IDF

Characterize the additional government support requested by fishers in SSF and IDF

Materials and Method

- **Study sites**: coastal provinces along the Gulf of Thailand
 - Chonburi
 - Chumphon
 - Phetchaburi
 - Prachuap Khiri Khan
 - Surat Thani
- Study period: Jul-Nov 2020
- Total number of respondents: n = 171 fishers



Materials and Method

Face-to-face interview

Minimum health protocols physical distance →





Open- and closed-ended questions based on FAO guidelines

- Characteristics of fishers
- Fishing activities
- Impacts of COVID-19
- Support to fishers to alleviate the impacts of COVID-19
- Additional government support requested by fishers



Data analysis

- Descriptive statistics: percentage, mean, and standard deviation
- Inferential statistics: comparison of means (Two Independent-sample) T-test); comparison of proportions (Two Proportions Unpooled Z-test); and p = 0.05 significance level




Gender ratio of the respondents (woman:men)














































Support to fishers to alleviate the impacts of COVID-19











Conclusion

- Most of the interviewed fishers in both SSF and IDF along the Gulf of Thailand experienced similar impacts of COVID-19
 - Decreased number of market channels
 - Decreased price of fish
 - Decreased revenue from catch
- The interviewed fishers received five kinds of support to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19
- Most of the interviewed fishers in both SSF and IDF still needed additional government support composed of seven categories

Ways forward

Further validate the impacts of COVID-19

 In-depth studies on the impacts of COVID-19 based on fishing gear types and gender Consider the specific additional government support in each category

Provide sustainable support to fishers in SSF and IDF

Consider the lessons learned

Extend fishing technology and other technical support

- Power-block system
- Refrigerated seawater system
- Net drum
- Vessel monitoring system
- Marketing strategies
- Alternative occupation
