Objective: To analyse the economic empowerment of women and resilience of small scale fisher households during the COVID 19 crisis

Respondents: Women workers in small scale fisher households in Ernakulum and Alappuzha districts in Kerala

The impacts of the pandemic on household income, expenditure, and indebtedness were analysed.

Conclusion

- Women contributed 40% of the total household income
- Indebtedness was more in Alappuzha district. More than 75% of small scale fisher households availed loans during covid(83% in Alappuzha and 63% in Ernakulam from informal sources)
- Although the average monthly income earned by the women workers was more in Alappuzha district during Covid, freedom to spend money was less.
- Increase in gender based violence (37%) and household work (63%) were reported by the respondents in Alappuzha district during the pandemic.
